In 1887 Samuel Legerwood Patterson deeded a plot surrounding his family cemetery to the Episcopal Diocese of Western North Carolina for the preservation of the cemetery and the establishment of a church. Built that year, the Chapel burned in 1916 and was reconstructed in 1917 under the direction of Reverend Hugh A. Dobbin. In 2005 the Chapel and cemetery were placed on the National Register of Historic Places.
